Lectionary Thoughts

This week's lectionary reflection on Psalm 29 comes from Rolf Jacobson at Luther Seminary in St. Paul, MN. He writes for Lectionary Homelitics which is online at www.goodpreacher.com.

Many scholars consider Psalm 29 to be one of the most ancient poems in the Psalter. Some scholars believe that the psalm began its existence as a Canaanite poem, most likely a poem to Baal, who was the god of rain and fertility, note the description of the thunderstorm in verses 3-9. In this theory, the psalm as it now appears was baptized with Yahwistic theology and rewritten to ascribe all power and blessing to the God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob. In this sense, the psalm can be viewed as similar to the celebration of Christmas, in which the church has taken a pagan midwinter ritual and rewritten with the symbols and narratives of the Christ story.

The psalm can be divided into three parts: verses 1-2 are the opening call to praise; verses 3-9 describe the reason for praising God; and verses 10-11 comprise the closing stanza of the psalm. Many have categorized the psalm as an enthronement psalm, because the Lord is praised as the One enthroned in verse 10 (cf. Ps 47, 93, 95-99). The psalm also bears some elements typical of praise psalms, such as the call to praise (vv.1-2) and the reasons for praise (vv. 3-11). But the category to which one assigns this psalm is not as important as engaging with its fundamental message: Power and blessing belong to the Lord alone.

As J. Clinton McCann has aptly noted, "Psalm 29 is fundamentally polemical, for it clearly attributes all power to Yahweh (Lord), who is enthroned in v. 9 with the exclamation, 'Glory!'"¹ This polemical edge is consistent with much of Israel's praise. The typical praise claim that "The Lord is God" is always both an affirmation of the Lord rules and also a denial of the ultimate claims of every other power—whether that of others gods, other nations, other people, other value systems, even ourselves. The claim that good things come from the Lord is likewise both a confession of faith in God's providence and simultaneously a rebuff to those powers that would claim our allegiance by granting us gifts.

Dayton United Lutheran Chorale

Last Sunday the DULC (Dayton United Lutheran Chorale) had its first rehearsal for their 2015 season.
